## Ketchup Stained Conflict

This past week was filled with milestones for me personally. We married off my youngest daughter last Saturday. Then Mary Kay and I celebrated our own 31st wedding anniversary on Wednesday. We enjoyed a quiet dinner together that evening, just the two of us, sharing happy memories together.

Memories we didn't share were the conflicts we had with one another in our early years. I recall one time in our first year that we fought and I foolishly threw a hamburger at Mary Kay. She ducked, the hamburger fell apart, and the ketchup side slammed into the lamp shade. For several years thereafter we had to turn the lampshade around so that the ketchup stain faced the corner of the room.

Today I can't even remember what we fought about. I just remember my own embarrassment of throwing a hamburger at Mary Kay and then being reminded of it for years afterward by the stained lampshade.

Our fights with one another are like that ketchup-stained lampshade, aren't they? The issue that seemed so important that at one time we were willing to fight over it eventually disappears completely from our memories. But the hurt of our words somehow stain our hearts for years to come.

Tonight we're going to talk about our conflicts. Sadly the Christian church has had its share of ketchup-stained - and sometimes blood-stained - fights over the years. The question we address tonight is how we might reconcile ourselves without stains, ketchup or otherwise. May Church Requel be known for its peaceful reconciliations.
